









Location Quotient- Nursing Assistants




Location Quotient- Registered Nurses

Location quotient of registered nurses, by area, May 2013




Annual Average Wage- Home Health Aides




Annual Average Wage- Nursing Assistants









Nursing Home Bed Days

- For 2012, there were 1,057,898 bed days available in Wyoming.
- For 2012, a total of 868,698 total days paid from all sources.
- This equates to an occupancy rate of 82%.
- For 2012, 63% of paid patient days were paid by Medicaid, 11% by Medicare, and 26% by all other sources.
