The LeadingAge Wyoming Annual meeting is being held September 5-6 at the UW Rochelle Center/Hilton Garden Inn, Laramie, Wyoming. We have many great sessions planned for this year's meeting.

We will discuss techniques and strategies to assist you in mitigating and preventing violence in your facilities and communities while understanding the existing reporting and tracking challenges and opportunities. This program will provide

- Identify techniques and strategies to mitigate and prevent violence in healthcare organizations
- Understand the importance of reporting and tracking/trending data on workplace violence
- Define the costs associated with workplace violence

Laura Castellanos will be presenting this program. She is an associate director at the American Hospital Association's (AHA) Health Research and Educational Trust (HRET). In her role, Laura manages the association-wide initiative Hospitals Against Violence focusing on educating the health care field on leading practices and innovative approaches to workplace safety and community violence prevention, including human trafficking, youth violence, workplace safety and workforce resiliency.

Nick Healey and Dallas Lain from DDRH will discuss "Involuntary Discharge/Appeal Process"

During this session, we will discuss the procedural and substantive legal considerations when a nursing home must discharge or transfer a resident, including the resident's right to a hearing, their right to appeal, and how the Medicaid application process affects the timeline

when the involuntary discharge is for nonpayment.


Pat Fritz, BSN, RN, NHA, Mountain Pacific will present "What Wyoming Nursing Homes Have Achieved."

“Burned Out or Fired Up? Reigniting Your Passion for Medicine”

“Disaster-Improv: Problem Solving Under Pressure”

We all share the goal of serving in an organization where people are engaged, the culture is awesome, and patients receive great care. But, we face more challenges than ever before. These days, it's easy to become discouraged and disengage.

Dr. Dan Diamond knows first hand how to get things done when times are tough and resources are scarce. He was the Director of the Medical Triage Unit at the New Orleans Convention Center after Katrina and he has responded to some of the most devastating international disasters of our time. His jaw-dropping stories will show you the power of mindset and equip you to thrive.

Dr. Dan Diamond came back from the trenches of Katrina with a burning question: “How is it that some people become unstoppable?” What he has discovered drives motivation, increases engagement and empowers corporations from the inside out.

Dr. Diamond has a passion for equipping people to perform under pressure. He founded and serves as the Director of the Nation’s first state-affiliated medical disaster response team and he has responded to a variety of international disasters. Most recently he responded to the typhoon in the Philippines and he served as the Medical Director for Medical Teams International’s First Response Team to

Haiti. Following Hurricane Katrina, he played a strategic role as Director of the Mass Casualty Triage Unit at the New Orleans Convention Center.

The American Academy of Family Physicians awarded Dr. Diamond the degree of Fellow and he is Board Certified with the American Board of Family Physicians. He has been interviewed on CNN, Larry King Live and Anderson Cooper. He is a member of the National Speakers Association and the Past-President of NSA Northwest.

As an experienced family physician and an award-winning educator, Dr. Diamond delivers practical information with creativity and skill. Participants experience learning through a variety of effective strategies that foster rapid mastery of new information. Well known for creating an exciting learning environment, Dr. Diamond engages the mind of the learner leaving participants with an experience and information they will never forget.

In 2010, the American Red Cross gave him the “Real Hero” award and he also received the Washington State Governor’s Award of Excellence for his work in Haiti. In 2014, Dr. Diamond received the President’s Volunteer Service Award from President Obama and he also received the Quality of Care Lifetime Achievement Award, Healthcare Heroes.
